**ORDER APPOINTING THE
WYOMING INSURANCE COMMISSIONER TOM GLAUSE
AS RECEIVER OF WINHEALTH PARTNERS**

THIS MATTER has come before the Court upon the State of Wyoming's Petition to Commence Delinquency Proceedings and the State's Motion and Memorandum in Support of Petition to Appoint the Insurance Commissioner as Receiver and the Court, having read the pleadings and being fully advised in this matter, finds that legal grounds exist under Wyo. Stat. Ann. §§ 26-28-105(a)(i), (ix), and 26-34-122(a) to appoint the Commissioner as the receiver of Winhealth Partners (Winhealth);

IT IS ORDERED, that

1. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-105(a)(i) and (ix), the Commissioner, Tom Glause, is immediately appointed as receiver of Winhealth for the purposes of conservation and rehabilitation.

2. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-112(f), the Commissioner is authorized to employ special deputy commissioners, counsel, clerks, and staff as he deems necessary without prior notice to or prior approval by the Court. The Commissioner may, subject to the Court's approval, fix the compensation of the same and pay their compensation out of the Winhealth's funds or assets.

3. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-112(b), the title to all of Winhealth's assets, property, contracts, rights of action, and books and records regardless of their location vests with the Commissioner and the Commissioner may record and take possession of

Winhealth's assets, property, contracts and right of action and its books and records, except that ancillary receivers in reciprocal states, as to assets located in their states, have the rights and powers prescribed in Wyo. Stat. Ann. 26-28-112(b) for ancillary receivers appointed in this state as to assets located in this state.

4. The Commissioner is authorized to take any and all actions that he deems appropriate in connection with the conservation and rehabilitation of Winhealth, and as provided in Wyo. Stat. Ann. §§ 26-28-101 through -131 and any other applicable law.

5. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-104, Winhealth and all its agents or employees are enjoined from transacting business on Winhealth's behalf unless directed to do so by the Commissioner.

6. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-104, Winhealth and all its agents or employees are enjoined from transacting business on Winhealth's behalf from wasting or disposing of Winhealth's assets or property.

7. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-118, all individuals or entities are enjoined from commencing or prosecuting any action against Winhealth.

8. Winhealth and its agents are enjoined from commencing or prosecuting any claim on Winhealth's behalf unless directed by the Commissioner.

9. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-118, all individuals and entities are enjoined from obtaining or enforcing any preference, judgment, attachment, security interest, or any other lien against Winhealth's property.


10. Under Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 26-28-104, all individuals except the Commissioner, or an individual directed by the Commissioner, are enjoined from withdrawing any funds from Winhealth's accounts and from removing any Winhealth property.

11. The Commissioner may impose moratoria on any payments as he deems necessary for the protection of the insureds and creditors. Further, that the terms of any moratoria shall apply in the same manner to all similarly situated persons and, under no circumstances, shall the Commissioner or his representatives be liable to any person for a good faith decision to impose or refrain from imposing such moratoria.

12. The Commissioner may arrange for the replacement or continuation of health coverage provided by Winhealth as he deems adequate to protect Winhealth's policyholders.

13. The Commissioner as receiver may issue any directives as he deems appropriate to memorialize and provide notice of the exercise of his authority under the Court's Order and applicable law.
